Dear Parents/Carers

Many thanks to those of you who have responded to the Reading questionnaire I sent out last week. To date, we have had 125 responses but we would love to hear from as many of you as possible so it's not too late to complete the questionnaire.

From the responses we have had so far, about 50% of you check your child's reading diary every day. We would love to know what we can do to increase this number and whether there is a reason why the number is so low.

Most of you felt that you had strategies to support your child's reading and the most popular was reading to them and with them, followed by encouraging a love of reading by buying books as gifts.

Approximately 1/3 of you felt that your child wasn't motivated to read at home. We understand that home learning has been very different, and often difficult over the last year and we are keen to find ways of supporting our families to engage in regular home learning again.

We also asked what training and support you might like to receive from us. Almost half of you said you would appreciate opportunities for book swaps and access to library time in school. This is something we would like to investigate further once Covid restrictions are relaxed.

Almost 1/3 of you also said that you would like to read with your child after school in the classroom. This could be a great way of school staff supporting you with strategies for shared reading at home. Again, we would like to investigate this further in the near future.

We understand that many parents/carers have had enough of online learning so we have decided to reintroduce a homework book in Key Stage One. We will still use Dojo for celebrations and sharing learning photograhs etc, but homework will now be set in workbooks. EYFS will continue to use Tapestry to share the children's learning.

Class teachers will now also take in reading diaries each week and sign them to say that they have seen them. Please try your best to sign your child's reading diary each time you hear them read. You don't need to write a comment

Please can you check at home to see if you have any reading books that need returning. We are getting very short of books in school.

The children also looked at the different parts which make a plant. They carefully separated each piece and named it correctly.
